HORTICULTURAL SHOW CLASSES

VEGETABLES

Judge: A Booth

1. 4 Potatoes – any variety
2. 3 Beetroot with tops trimmed to 3"
3. 3 Onions not exceeding 250 gms. Dressed.
4. 3 large Onions with roots and tops cleaned.
5. 6 Shallots.
6. 3 Bulbs Garlic
7. 3 Carrots with tops, trimmed to 3"
8. 3 Turnips with tops, trimmed to 3"
9. 1 green Cabbage – any variety with 3" of stem.
10. 1 red Cabbage – any variety with 3" of stem.
11. 1 Cauliflower with 3" of stem.
12. 1 Celery
13. 1 head of Lettuce, roots washed and staged sat on jam jar of water
14. 4 Tomatoes
15. 6 Cherry Tomatoes
16. Truss of Tomatoes
17. 1 Cucumber
18. Bunch of 8 Radishes with tops washed.
19. Bunch of 10 Spring Onions
20. 6 pods of Peas
21. 6 French Beans
22. 6 Broad Beans
23. 3 Rhubarb Sticks
24. 1 Marrow – maximum length 15"
25. 3 Courgettes – n/e 6"
26. Any other vegetable not mentioned above. Min.2 and Max. 6 specimens per dish.
27. Tray of 3 vegetables displayed within an area 18" deep by 12" wide.
28. **BINGLEY SHOW TOP TRAY** 1st £8 2nd £4 3rd £2
A collection of 6 vegetables, one dish of each, dishes to contain same number of vegetables as specified in single dish classes. To be staged with a frontage not exceeding 3'6"

FRUIT

29. Currants 10 strings of one cultivar.
30. Gooseberry. 10 fruits.
31. Raspberries. 10 fruits
32. Strawberries. 10 fruits
33. Strawberries. Alpine 10 fruits.
34. Any other fruit. Min. 2

FLOWERS Judge: S Ryan

35. One Vase. 3 Stems Alstroemeria
36. Vase of Perennials, mixed varieties, arranged for all round effect.
37. Vase of Perennial, one variety.
38. Sweet Peas. One Vase 7 spikes.
39. Sweet Peas. Two vases, 5 spikes each, distinct varieties
40. Sweet Peas. One vase/Bowl, not less than 15 spikes, arranged for effect.
(Foliage and Gypsophilia allowed. No wiring of Sweet Peas allowed)
41. One Box. 6 Blooms. Violas or Pansies.
42. One Vase. 3 Blooms. Carnations. One Cultivar
43. One Vase. Single Carnation.
44. One Vase. 3 Blooms. Pinks.
45. One Vase. Hardy or Half Hardy Annuals.
46. One Vase. Any other cut flowers not mentioned above e.g. dahlias
47. One cactus plant or succulent
48. One Pelargonium. Regal or Zonal.
49. One Fuchsia – any variety
50. One Coleus.
51. Pot plant in bloom.
52. Pot plant foliage.
53. Single Rose, any cultivar.
54. Vase of 3 Roses – any one variety or mixed
55. Vase of Floribunda Roses.
56. Vase or Bowl of Roses. Any cultivar. Judged on all round effect.

A blue/grey background will be provided, painted background may be used.

(entries for these classes must be submitted before 19th July in order for space to be allocated)

(Bingley Town Council would like you to create and exhibit that would be donated and used to decorate the town and its shops in the days/weeks following the show)

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

- The General Rules of the Society will apply to this Section.
- All exhibits must be grown by the exhibitor, with the exception of Floral Art Classes.
- Society vases to be used where applicable
- Exhibitors can enter as many exhibits in any class as desired and there are no restrictions on the number of prizes won.
- The Committee shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits from whatever cause. All exhibits must be at the sole risk of exhibitor.
- All exhibits to remain on show until 4.30pm and must be removed by 5.15pm
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit.

SUGGESTIONS TO EXHIBITORS

- Read schedule carefully. If you need help, contact Show Secretary
- Allow ample time for staging.
- Particular attention should be paid to the number of specimens for which the schedule asks, as an exhibit consisting of more or less may be disqualified.
- Be a Good Sport. The Judge's decision should be accepted with good grace.
- Entry Form should be completed carefully.
