- The Committee reserves the right to refuse any exhibit.

### **SUGGESTIONS TO EXHIBITORS**

- Read schedule carefully. If you need help, contact Show Secretary
- Allow ample time for staging.
- Particular attention should be paid to the number of specimens for which the schedule asks, as an exhibit consisting of more or less may be disqualified.
- Be a Good Sport. The Judge's decision should be accepted with good grace.

- F1** 4 Potatoes – any variety
- F2** 3 Beetroot with tops trimmed to 3"
- F3** 3 Onions not exceeding 250 gms. Dressed
- F4** 3 large Onions with roots and tops cleaned
- F5** 6 Shallots
- F6** 3 Bulbs Garlic
- F7** 3 Carrots with tops, trimmed to 3"
- F8** 3 Turnips with tops, trimmed to 3"
- F9** 1 green Cabbage – any variety with 3" of stem
- F10** 1 red Cabbage – any variety with 3" of stem
- F11** 1 Cauliflower with 3" of stem
- F12** 1 Celery
- F13** 1 head of Lettuce, roots washed and staged sat on jam jar of water
- F14** 4 Tomatoes
- F15** 6 Cherry Tomatoes
- F16** Truss of Tomatoes
- F17** 1 Cucumber
- F18** Bunch of 8 Radishes with tops washed
- F19** Bunch of 10 Spring Onions
- F20** 6 pods of Peas
- F21** 6 French Beans
- F22** 6 Broad Beans
- F23** 3 Rhubarb Sticks
- F24** 1 Marrow – maximum length 15"
- F25** 3 Courgettes – n/e 6"
- F26** Any other vegetable not mentioned above. Min. 2 and Max. 6 specimens per dish

**F27** Tray of 3 vegetables displayed within an area 18" deep by 12" wide

**F28 BINGLEY SHOW TOP TRAY** Prize Money - 1<sup>st</sup> £8; 2<sup>nd</sup> £4; 3<sup>rd</sup> £2

A collection of 6 vegetables, one dish of each, dishes to contain same number of vegetables as specified in single dish classes. To be staged with a frontage not exceeding 3'6"

#### Fruit

**F29** Currants 10 strings of one cultivar

**F30** Gooseberry - 10 fruits

**F31** Raspberries - 10 fruits

**F32** Strawberries - 10 fruits

**F33** Strawberries Alpine - 10 fruits

**F34** Any other fruit - Min. 2

#### Flowers

**F35** One Vase - 3 Stems Alstroemeria

**F36** Vase of Perennials - mixed varieties - arranged for all round effect

**F37** Vase of Perennial - one variety

**F38** Sweet Peas - One Vase 7 spikes

**F39** Sweet Peas - Two vases - 5 spikes each - distinct varieties\*

**F40** Sweet Peas - One vase / Bowl - not less than 15 spikes - arranged for effect\*

\*(Foliage and Gypsophila allowed. No wiring of Sweet Peas allowed)

**F41** One Box - 6 Blooms - Violas or Pansies

**F42** One Vase - 3 Blooms – Carnations - One Cultivar

**F43** One Vase - Single Carnation

**F44** One Vase - 3 Blooms – Pinks

**F45** One Vase - Hardy or Half Hardy Annuals

**F46** One Vase - Any other cut flowers not mentioned above e.g. dahlias

**F47** One cactus plant or succulent

**F48** One Pelargonium - Regal or Zonal

**F49** One Fuchsia – any variety

**F50** One Coleus

**F51** Pot plant in bloom (excluding orchids)

**F52** Pot plant foliage

**F53** Pot plant – orchid

**F54** Single Rose, any cultivar

**F55** Vase of 3 Roses – any one variety or mixed

**F56** Vase of Floribunda Roses

**F57** Vase or Bowl of Roses - Any cultivar - Judged on all round effect

#### Floral Art

The space for exhibits will be 76cms wide, and 76cm height.

A blue/grey background will be provided, painted background may be used.

(entries for these classes must be submitted before 19<sup>th</sup> July in order for space to be allocated)

**NOVICE CLASS** (An exhibitor who has not won more than three first prizes at any show)

**F58** A colourful basket – no accessories

#### **OPEN CLASSES**

**F59** Arrangement in an unusual container – no accessories (not too large please)

**F60** Arrangement of 5 flowers and unlimited greenery – accessories allowed

**F61** Miniature – arrangement in an egg sup – no accessories – not exceeding 4"

#### **CHILDREN'S CLASS**

**F62** Arrangement using a cup and saucer – any fresh material
